#### STUDENT ATTENDANCE

We are aiming to improve the attendance rate of students in 2019. All students who achieve more than 95% attendance for the term will be rewarded and acknowledged. #### **Bus Travel**

#### Change of address / phone number

The School Office should be notified of any change of address or phone number immediately. If intending to transfer to another school the Principal should be notified.

#### **School Hours**

Teachers are responsible for supervision of students from 8.30am until all children have left the school grounds. Special permission needs to be sought if children are going to be on School grounds outside these hours, as teachers are not available to supervise.

### **Student Safety Leaving School**

Staff are assigned duties at the end of the school day to ensure the safety of students as they leave the school grounds.

NO CHILD IS TO LEAVE THE SCHOOL PREMISES ALONE.

Children who are picked up will wait on the lunch seats for families to come and collect them. Children need to be picked up from the Grace St entrance to the school, not from the Conapaira St entrance near the buses.

#### **Office Hours**

The front office hours are from 8.30am until 4.00pm Monday to Friday. At times the phone may be unattended but messages can be left on the answering machine at any time. Should a family member telephone a teacher or student during class time a message will be passed on or a more convenient time to call back will be suggested.
